

Patriotic Review Volume 5 Issue 1

Message from State Advocate 3/10/2023

Dealing with the press can be a tricky thing sometimes. Hell, the FBI is even investigating some Catholics as domestic terrorists. Not as bad as Diocletian, but still.... Care must be exercised to protect oneself and the Order from malicious attacks! As has previously been stated:

Each Grand Knight is encouraged to make public the good works of his Council in their local papers and to submit such information to Columbia Magazine for possible publication. No opinion pieces, just 'Hey, look at what we did!' That is advertising the Order to the world, not hiding your light under a bushel-basket so as to speak [cf Luke 11:33]. The local Councils need to do a heck of a lot more of that!

The problem comes from opinion articles. Each of us has the absolute right to express ourselves **as individuals**, and even to make known our affiliation with Church or Order. However, **none of us have the ability to state that we speak for the Order or Church**. In the latter case that is the role of our Bishop or designee. In the former case that is reserved strictly to the State Deputy or his designee.

In this politically charged and antagonistic environment we need to speak as one voice, and that voice is our State Deputy (or designee). We individually can and should speak out on issues but speak out as individuals. Frankly, 15 letters to the editor from individuals has a heck of a lot more impact that one editorial. That is simply because 15 is greater than 1 and "the press" responds to volume (both in numbers and in display), not necessarily fact or reasoning.

The rule is this: You can say who you are, but you cannot say "I speak for" or "I represent" or "I am the "X" of the Knights of Columbus" and "the Order believes ..." unless specifically authorized. Representing what the Order does or does not believe belongs to the designated spokesmen for the Order, not to us individually.

This above rule applies when one of our own stumbles as well. In the first case, for the time being, each person in the US is innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. If you want to find out how bad accusations without substance can be please read Emile Zolla and *j'accuse (Dreyfus Affair)*. [cf: 1 Samuel 24:9; Exodus 23:1; Proverbs 17:4; 1 Timothy 5:19; Proverbs 18:7-8; Proverbs 26:20-21; Proverbs 11:12; Romans 1:29; finally and perhaps most importantly: Matthew 7:12 and Luke 6:31] To recap:

- Speak out on issues proudly, but as an individual.
- Do not assume to speak for the Order.
- Contact the State Advocate or State Deputy if you have a question or if the press contact you on an issue (local, State or national).

Thank you for keeping these rules in mind. If you have any concerns or questions, please contact me or the State Deputy. $\quad \bullet$
