Life Report Summary – July 18, 2026

1. Birthright of Southern NH, Derry

Mrs. Jackie Hynes, Board Member, is organizing a fundraising banquet at Saint Matthew's Parish Center in Windham. It will take place on Saturday, September 12, 2026. Council 7572 in Windham have volunteered to host the event and serve the food.

2. 40 Days For Life Fall 2026 Campaign in Concord, Manchester, Greenland

Mike Cunningham, brother Knight in Council 5163, Manchester, has taken over this campaign from Norm Thibault, who, sadly, died last spring. The campaign runs for six weeks from September 27th to November 7. Each local Council in the Concord, Manchester, and Greenland areas will commit to a one-hour prayer session in front of the abortion facilities asking our Blessed Mother to intervene with each pregnant mother to choose life for her pre-born baby.

3. Annual NH Right to Life Mass/Rally/March/Luncheon, Concord

As Chairman for this most important pro-life event in the year, this will be my last. This event will take place on Saturday, January 16, 2027, beginning at Christ The Kings Church for a 10 AM pro-life Mass celebrated by Pastor Roberge. Hundreds of our brother Knights and their families attend in conjunction with hundreds of other Christian families and organizations who value the sanctity of human life from the moment of conception through all stages to the end of natural life. The overall theme of the event is: "Empowering Pregnant Women to Choose Life."

4. Annual KOC Pro-Life Fundraising Dinner, Suncook

The tentative date for this fundraising event, which financially benefits the pregnancy care facilities throughout the state, will be Saturday, February 20, 2027. The tentative location will be at Saint John The Baptist Parish Center in Suncook, NH. (Allenstown) All of the net profits raised will be distributed to the major pregnancy care centers, which will support their life-saving efforts assisting pregnant women to choose life for their babies before and after birth. These centers rely on donations 100% in order to stay open, since they do not receive any financial support or donations from the state of NH or from any agency of the federal government.
